

## Rules & Regulations ~ Eureka College Summer Choral Camp 2012

Please read the following carefully. These rules apply to all campers. Counselors are instructed to report any violations to the Dean of Men or Women who will present serious cases of violation to the Camp Director for appropriate action. Violations may result in camp dismissal.

1. Campers are expected to attend all regularly scheduled rehearsals, classes, and other planned activities unless they are ill. Illness should be reported immediately to one of the counselors or the Dean of Men/Women.
2. The use of controlled substances (drugs) and alcohol is prohibited in the camp. Anyone found using such substances will be immediately expelled from the camp. Parents will be called to remove them from the college campus. Necessary prescription drugs must be reported on the health card required at registration.
3. All Eureka College campus buildings are smoke-free! Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
4. Visitation. Visitation in dormitory rooms between the sexes or guests, other than parents and immediate family members, IS NOT permitted. The only designated place for visitation is the first floor lounge. All other meeting places are restricted. Visitors and guests of campers must register with either the Dean of Men or Women and are subject to all rules and regulations. Boys are allowed only on the first floor.
5. All DVD movies shown in the first floor lounge are to be either PG or PG-13 (ask one of the Counselor's for approval).
6. Leaving Campus. Students will not be permitted to leave campus unless parent/guardian has filed a leave of absence form. A "Leave of Absence Form will be available at registration on June 10<sup>th</sup> and must be completed for each anticipated absence.
7. Motorized Transportation: Students **MAY NOT** bring a motorized vehicle of any kind for use during the Camp or ride with anyone else during their stay here.
8. Lights Out. Students will be in their rooms for the night by 10:30 PM with lights out and bed check at 11:00 PM. Watch the daily schedule for exceptions to this rule.
9. Vandalism and theft will result in immediate dismissal. Please treat the buildings, equipment and furniture with care. If vandalism occurs, those involved will be financially responsible for all expenses necessary for repair.
10. External Residence Hall doors: For security and safety reasons, outside doors as well as the fire doors in the dormitory must not be propped open at any time.
11. Fire alarms and equipment are for emergency use only - do not tamper with these systems or equipment.
12. Window screens in the dormitory are not to be removed from the windows at any time for any reason.
13. Dormitory lounge furniture must not be taken into student's rooms.
14. Law prohibits firearms, weapons, and fireworks of any type.
15. Lost dormitory keys. There will be a \$50.00 replacement charge for lost keys. The fee is high because if the lock is lost – it must be changed.
16. Noise. Other non-music camp guests who are working at the college this summer may be staying in Langston Hall. Please be considerate of the needs of others at all times and keep excessive noise at a reasonable level for the time of day on campus and in the residence hall in the evening.
17. Any concerns or complaints should be directed to one of the counselors or Deans who will deal with them directly, either at once or by carrying them to the appropriate authority. 18. Personal responsibilities of students; (a) Keep rooms locked, (b) Loss of personal property, property damage, induced accident, or injury; (c) Cost of mischievous acts or vandalism; (d) Know the daily schedule and adhering to it. Attendance is mandatory at all rehearsals, sectionals, classes, concerts, recitals and evening activities.
19. Insurance. The college **DOES NOT** provide health and accident coverage for Summer Choral Camp activities; however, the Eureka Hospital's Emergency Room will treat minor/major injuries on a per service basis. Let your counselor know if you are not feeling well.
